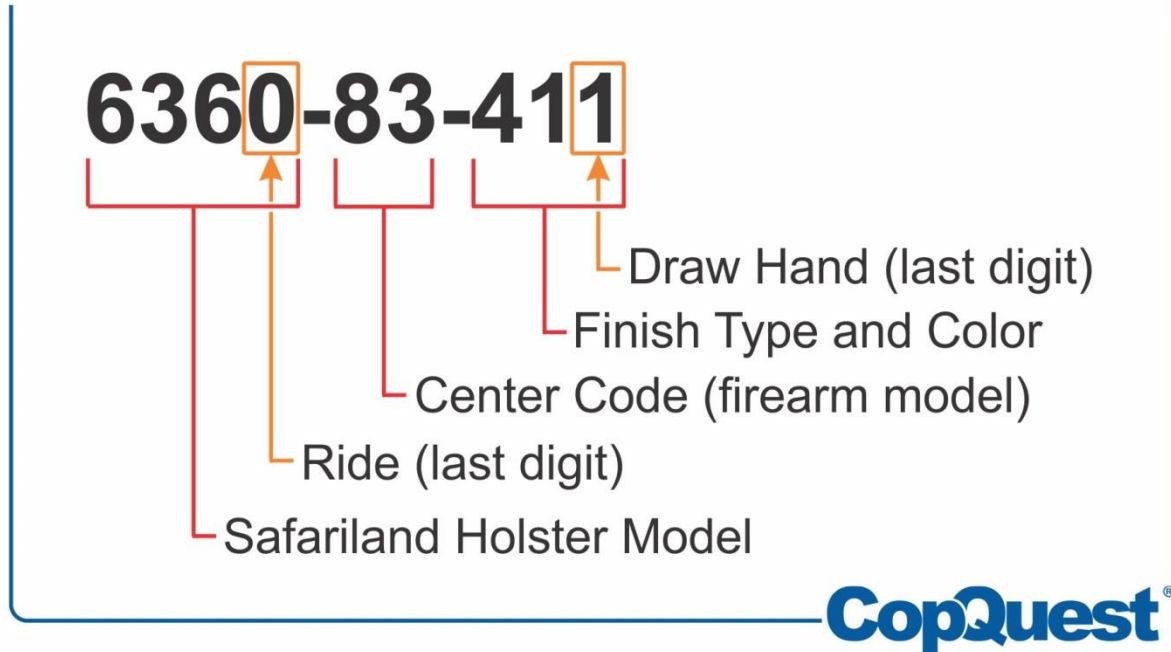


Safariland holster numbers consist of three sections: the holster model number, the center code, and the finish code/draw hand.

Safariland Holster Number Decoder



Holster Model Number:

The holster model number contains multiple pieces of information in a 4-to-7-digit code format, such as the holster series, the holster’s level of retention/features, ride height, and if it is optics ready.

Holster Series

Safariland produces holsters from varying materials and they are separated into two groups as indicated by the first digit on the holster model. If the holster model starts with a “6” then it is part of the 6000 series of holsters, whereas if the first digit of the holster model is a “7” then it is part of the 7000 (7TS) series.

Safariland’s 6000 Series of holsters are constructed of either SafariLaminate™ or Boltaron (aka STX). SafariLaminate™ finish is designed to match traditional leather looks with synthetic longevity and ease of cleaning. Boltaron is a proprietary thermoplastic alloy modeled to the exact weapon fit specification. Inside of the 6000 series holsters is SafariSuede™, which is a lining designed to help protect the firearm sight and finish. Popular duty holster examples within the 6000 series are the 6360, and 6390.

Holsters listed under the 7000 (7TS) series are also thermoformed to exact weapon fit specification, but uses SafariSeven™, a proprietary DuPont nylon blend. This polymer offers enhanced heat and cold tolerances, making it almost impervious to the elements. In addition, it is highly durable, extremely lightweight, impact-resistant and non-abrasive to the firearm finish.

Ride Height

There are three different ride height available for duty holsters which is expressed as the 4th numerical digit in the holster model sequence.

1. Mid-ride (the most common) is indicated by a “0” (i.e., 6360, - mid-ride level III duty holster)
2. Low-ride (1.5” drop) is indicated by a “5” (i.e., 6365 - low-ride Level III duty holster)
3. Hi-ride (the least common) is indicated by a “2” (i.e., 6362 - hi-ride Level III duty holster)

As a note, these codes only apply to Safariland duty holsters because Safariland’s tactical holsters have different holster model numbers ending in either a “4” or “5” depending on holster retention as well as multiple vertical leg strap options.

Level of Retention

Safariland Level I Retention duty holsters are models 6390 and 7390 equipped with the ALS® (Automatic Locking System) only.

Safariland Level II Retention models include the 6280 and 7280 which have the SLS™ (Self-Locking System) only. Holster models 6390 or 7390 can be rated at Level II Retention by adding an ALS guard, a button/cover that sits over the ALS lever.

Safariland Level III Retention models include the 6360 and 7360, and they have both the ALS® lock and the SLS™ strap. Holster models 6360 and 7360 can be rated Level IV Retention when adding an SLS Sentry Guard, a device that works for the SLS strap, similar to the way an ALS guard works for an ALS lever.

Here is a useful list of different holster models and their level of retention:

1. Level I: 6390/6395/6392, 7390/7395/7392
2. Level II: 6280/6285/6282, 7280/7285/7282
3. Level III: 6360/6365/6362, 7360/7365/7362

To give you a more comprehensive list, the 6354 is a Level I holster (similar to the 6390) but is equipped with a QLS 19 locking fork rather than a model 6070/6075 UBL (Universal Belt Loop) adapter. Similarly, the 6304 is a Level III holster (just like the 6360), but is also equipped with the QLS 19 fork instead of the UBL.

All Safariland holsters are compatible with the QLS 19 locking fork, but it is sold separately unless stated.

Optics

An additional code is added to the first four digits of the model number to distinguish holsters that are designed for optics. If a model number does not have this code, the holster is not set up for an optic. The first was the 6354DO (Doctor Optic), but as optics have evolved, RDS (Red Dot Sight) holsters have become more relevant to accommodate a much wider selection of optics. For example, there is the 6360RDS, 6390RDS, 7390RDS and so on.

Center Code:

The center code is the second set of numbers in the holster code and refers to the gun and light/laser combination. The center codes range from two to six numbers, with more center codes developed as the need arises. Because the numbers can be confusing, it can take some practice reading and understanding what they mean.

One of the more popular holsters is for the Sig Sauer P320 with fit code “450” for the full-size 4.7” barrel or “750” for the Carry version with a 3.9” barrel.

Additional numbers are added to the center code to signify if the holster will fit a weapon light. For standard lights, such as the Streamlight TLR-1/1HL, the code is “2”.

So, for a Sig P320 full-size holster with a Streamlight TLR-1/1HL the code will read “4502”.

Here is a list of popular Glock, Sig Sauer, and Smith & Wesson center codes followed by a breakdown of the different light codes.

Finish Code and Draw Hand:

The third set of numbers in the holster code will either be 2 or 3 digits detailing the color, finish, and draw hand.

The color and finish are indicated by the first one or two numbers and the draw hand is indicated by the final number.

Finish codes ending in “1” are for right-handed holsters and “2” for left-handed holster

A popular color/finish code is “41” which stands for STX Plain Black. A code of “412” indicates a left-handed STX Plain Black holster.
