During this unpreceded time, we intend to further this mission by supporting law enforcement and military agencies who are out on the front lines, selflessly exposing themselves to the deadly, respiratory disease COVID-19 (coronavirus).

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), there is currently no vaccine to prevent COVID-19 and warn the virus can remain infectious on hard surfaces, such as plastic and steel, for up to three (3) days.

In order to prevent exposure and illness, it is critical for first responders to <u>frequently clean and thoroughly</u> <u>disinfect</u> all duty equipment such as holsters, duty belts and accessories.

Below are important guidelines on how to properly clean and disinfect Safariland[®] / Bianchi[®] duty gear equipment:

- Visibly dirty surfaces should be cleaned using a detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.
- Duty gear products can be cleaned by wiping with a damp cloth. Any liquid or powder soap and water along with a scouring pad will assist in cleaning.
- Once product is thoroughly clean, proceed to disinfect product with a surface safe disinfectant such as antibacterial soap, Lysol, 10% solution of household chlorine bleach or <u>EPA-registered</u> <u>disinfectant</u> wipes.
- CAUTION: Some listed chemicals on EPA site may result in damage to the finish of the product.
- Refer to disinfectant label for the required contact time, the product shelf-life, and all safety instructions prior to handling and use.
- The surface should remain 'visibly wet' for the prescribed contact time in order to produce disinfection. NOTE: If the surface is not kept wet for the appropriate amount of time to kill the microorganisms, it is possible to spread microorganisms with the wipe.
- After prescribed disinfectant contact time, surface may be wiped dry, or the surface may be allowed to air dry. Be sure the product is completely dry prior to use.
